Everyone is drawn to the water. What could be nicer than just watching the river flow? Breathe deeply and you're there. The Ruhr is never far away in Mülheim. And here it is relaxing and exciting at the same time. Having everything close together, that's our advantage: a large city with the charm of a village with the best of both.



Remarkable assets

Get on your bike and show the chain what you're made of: 50 km from one beauty spot to the next is a piece of cake. Anyone who wants to thread the so-called "Mülheimer Ruhrperlen" (pearls of the Ruhr) as they go along needs only a bicycle, whether their own, or a rented "Ruhrperlen-bicycle". Thanks to the modern Ruhrperlen-App and satellite technology, you always know where you are, and which of the Pearls is in front of you, whether "Ruhr Nature", "Culture" or "Industrial History". These Pearls are not all round and smooth, and some of them defy expectations or go against the grain. This is why some Pearls are called the "Old Banger" or "Generation Bench", they offer a view with an open-air frame, or a water tower with no water. So that your long-term memory also gets something out of it, your personal digital guide invites you to take part in a quiz. How many of the 27 Pearls end up on your thread at once is up to you. Tomorrow is another day for pearl collecting

City and countryside

Experienced cyclists know the advantages of riverbank paths: it's naturally downhill from the source



to the mouth of the river. Between Winterberg and Duisburg lie the most varied 230 km of cycle paths in Germany, the **RuhrtalRadweg (Ruhr Valley Cycle Route)**. There is no either-or here, but rather everything: nature and culture.

What could be better than the wind in your face and the day's destination in your sights? The beer garden is calling already. And the visitors never cease to be amazed. This is supposed to be the Ruhr Area? Absolutely! Delightful silence and water lilies alternate with squads of trainers, driving on the athletes on the water. Relaxed you glance across from the ice-cream café to the grass on the riverbank. The bikes are taking a break, your spirit relaxes, and

a few kilometres down the road you can dive back into the metropolis feeling.

We have many green hearts

Hiking in the middle of the city? Where can you do that? Beyond the well groomed flower beds, which of course we have, the green centre of the city awaits you: the MüGa, the grounds of the Mülheim State Garden Show 1992. The traffic is just a faint whisper, and gets drowned out by the silence when you explore the paths by the water, meander through the grass, and eventually find a quiet spot. Quick getaways from everyday life, conferences, or wherever you want to step back from. This is where you want to be.

Twelve metres of fun

Man the oars, ladies and gentlemen! There's a Viking in all of us, trying to get out. Can you get together 14 family members, or do you currently have 13 best friends? If so, MüWi awaits, the Viking longboat on the Ruhr. It has everything, from a day trip to the fun of trying out something new. And of course, the experienced captain is always aboard, your own personal Viking chief. And for anyone who still wants more when they reach the aim, there's MüWi with extras: canoeing, cycling, the "Weiße Flotte" or something tasty.



Up and down the Ruhr

Or just down, and then come back on foot? Line journeys, special routes or charter? Either way, the main thing is there are boats available for outings. From April to October, the banks are close enough to touch, and the smells of sunscreen, ice cream and afternoon tea gossip are in the air. The breeze blows through your hair. An outing like a childhood memory. And suddenly you feel like waving to people on the shore, out of sheer joie de vivre. Do you know the longest word on our boat? Ruhrschifffahrtskapitänsmützenschild! ('Ruhr boating captain's cap peak') Since 1927. A little of it is in the name already. And you can also have a white wedding on the boats of the "Weiße Flotte".




Pedalling allowed

This deceleration is great! Here you don't have to wait for your soul to catch up with you. You only go as fast as you pedal. The Escargot boats of the "Grüne Flotte" are quite rightly named after snails. Anyone who also

wants to be lazy once in a while can just take the larger Escargot with an auxiliary motor. Kitchen, toilet and bunks? Sure, it's all there. Those who want to be closer to the water can take the four-seater Canadian boats.

A home for boats

Looks a little like a boat, but doesn't go anywhere. The "Wasserbahnhof" (water station) on the so-called "Lock Island" is the start and end of every boat tour with the "Weiße Flotte". Even for landlubbers, lean on the bridge rail and watch the lock operation from directly above. Mülheim has 14 km of river to offer, and it is particularly exciting here.





Amongst river rats and flatworms

Where the fish leap up their ladder, the grey heron stalks and electricity is made from water, there you can find the "Haus Ruhrnatur", at the far end of an island in the Ruhr. Here you can turn the crank yourself to make the water flow, and explore the Ruhr ecosystem. Everything to do with flora, fauna, climate and energy can be found at the science museum of the "RWW (Rheinisch-Westfälische Wasserwerksgesellschaft mbH)", playfully presented by museum educationists. And then you can have delicious coffee and a piece of cake in the museum café.

Now get going

This is another option! Activity tours instead of "normal tourism". Get on your mountain bike, grab your walking sticks, or go climbing around the Ruhr Area. We offer sporting exploration to suit any taste. Sport, culture, nature, plus a guide to show you the way. Get up, get out, get away the smart way! An office bike ride instead of an office party, rock climbing with colleagues instead of chatting at the coffee machine.

Not just walking around the museum, but jogging to the museum. Culture and nature at a running pace. Two horses on the pasture to the left, a family of ducks on the right, and an angler just reeling in a fish from the Ruhr, while you jog along the towpath and wave to a daytrip boat from the

"Weiße Flotte". Or would you prefer a tour from the cloister to the church to the tourist attractions? Walk where you want, at whatever pace you feel like; our guide at your side knows what's what. Sounds like a walkover, doesn't it?

No need to rush

We can also switch down a gear. After all, you're here to relax. Have yourself shown around. But not just anywhere; go even where no one else can get to. We'll lay the city at your feet. How about a 360° view from the aquarius watermuseum? Or water marsh: Have you ever considered a city from the perspective of water? Regardless of how mobile you want to be, we'll show you the very best of Mülheim.

Rendezvous with a city

Some cities seem to keep visitors at a distance. But you can be on firstname terms with Mülheim. A city you can touch. And to get an overview, the best thing to do is join our city guides on a sightseeing tour, on foot, by bicycle, or on a bus. How do you fancy it? The classic meander through, or would you prefer a special themed tour such as the "Mölmsche Stielmus-Tour", the mystical twilight tour, along the Ruhr, on the Church Hill in the Old Town, or walking through the city quarters? Get right under our skin. We can cope with it.

Spotlight

"Mülheim? Isn't that the city with the theatre?" The "Theater an der Ruhr" (Theatre on the Ruhr) has a global reputation, and not only on account of its international partnership projects. Over here at summer nights, a special spectacle unfolds: the "Weiße Nächte" (White Nights) – free-admission theatre in the open air.

Fancy some **plays**? At the start of each summer, the theatrical scene turns Mülheim into a Mecca for contemporary German drama. At the end, a jury awards the Mülheim Acting Prize, for example to René Pollesch and Elfriede Jelinek.

Still want more theatre atmosphere? Then amuse yourself at "KULTUR. GUT". The "Ringlokschuppen" brings renowned cabaret artists, comedians and musicians to the city and onto the stage.

Feast for the ears or thought factory

From the outside it looks like a palace; inside it's full of possibilities: the **Municipal Hall** on the Ruhr. Glittering balls or conventions, leisurely



receptions or musical delights at symphony concerts or the Ruhr Piano Festival. On the stage in the grand theatre hall, Romeo swears by the moon, and virtuoso pianists tinkle the ivories. It's all there, from the high-end technology to the customised catering to the organisation. Modern or cosy, we can do anything. More than 1,000 participants? No problem. Club atmosphere at the after-work party? Naturally. Champagne reception on the terrace by the river? Take a glass from the tray!

Village in the city

Freshly arrived cyclists push their bikes over the cobbles of the **Old Town**. "Hey look, a beer garden! Fantastic. Let's stop here for a bit." Narrow streets and half-timbered houses delight visitors. The Old Town is high up, so you should ask for the Church Hill. Altbier and the topfermented local beer Mölmsch are fresh on tap. Tasty food is a must. Flea markets, wine festivals and the captivating Christmas market are not the only places where there's a village atmosphere.



Enticements

You have to see it for yourself; **muse-ums** in particular entice visitors into a city. Sometimes a single picture or a special exhibit can suffice. And in Mülheim there are loads:

Eye-catchers

More than just a tip for rainy days. You can't miss it, as the municipal **Art Museum** is right in the middle of the town, in the building of the **Old Post Office** from 1897. Care to hear some of the names we have in Mülheim? Baselitz, Beckmann, Braque, Chagall, Feiniger, Jawlensky, Kirchner, Marc, Nolde, Macke, Picasso and Zille. And don't miss the **exhibition taking place from the 2nd Feb. – 27th Apr. 2014: "Yearning for the lost paradise" with top-class paintings by August Macke. And that's not all. Mülheim even has its own famous**



artistic sons, Otto Pankok and Heinrich Siepmann. Perspective is everything! Enjoy Mülheim's outlooks on painting, sculpture, photography and new media.

Get up the courage

Where better for the **Founders and Entrepreneurs Museum** than in the House of Commerce? Even pioneers like Thyssen and Stinnes, who built up vast empires, had to take that first step into independence. Ten industries and ten entrepreneurs are presented, including the founders of Tengelmann and Aldi. Anyone looking to get up the courage to establish their own business can pick up some motivation here. And that's because success stories are inspiring!

Saddlers, furriers and embossers

The river and the extensive oak forests made it possible for Mülheim to be a centre of leather production for centuries. The former Abel leather factory now houses the **Leather and Tanner Museum**. And here you can touch, hear and smell the interactive exhibits. After this, you'll look at your own shoes in a new light.

Preachers and healers

Do you know the song, "Ich bete an die Macht der Liebe" ("I pray to the power of love")? It gets played at the Ceremonial Tattoo, and was written by a man from Mülheim. With his songs, sermons and ascetic piety, lay preacher Gerhard Tersteegen was one of those responsible for the Christian Enlightenment in the 18th century. For him, actively practising the doctrine of compassion consist-





ed in setting up free medicines for the poor. In his house in the historic Old Town, you can find the local history museum "Tersteegenhaus".

Efficient nuns – 800 years Saarn Cloister

A cloister was a self-contained universe. Starting in the early 13th century, Cistercian nuns here practised not only pious seclusion, but also operated mills, kept gardens and engaged in arts and crafts. Following a turbulent period, the **Saarn Cloister** is now a cultural location, museum, meeting place, venue for celebrations, herb garden, café and spiritual anchor point. 2014 is a special jubilee year – its the 800th birthday of the cloister – celebrate this with us!

Culture locomotive


The name sounds like a derelict building, but names can be misleading. The **Ringlokschuppen** embodies culture. The listed railway depot is an exciting place, and not just architecturally: free contemporary theatre, concerts, cabaret, performing arts and comedy. In the summer, people relax at the open-air cinema and outdoor restaurants, while children play on the lawns at the



MüGa park, and sun worshippers stock up on solar energy.

Experience water

You should grant yourself this wet stop on the Industrial Heritage Trail, the **Aquarius Water Museum**. It was a drinking water reservoir from 1893 onwards, and now the tower is occupied by an interactive, multimedia presentation of interesting facts about water. The view is magnificent, and the insights enlightening, from the Global Water Summit, to waterbased technology, to natural wonders of water. And if you feel like getting married, you can do that here, too.



The city in the mirror

One little 'click', and we've got a digital photo or a holiday movie. But how did it all start? The Museum Prehistory of Film in the Camera Obscura commemorates the origins of film and photography. Nowhere else in the world it has a larger, walkable pinhole camera: the whole city in a 360° panorama. Did you ever turn a school jotter into a flip-book? Here you can be reminded of your physics teacher, and refresh your memory of optics with numerous exhibits, reconstructions and interactive installations. When photographers still had a black cloth over their heads, and staying still was all part of taking a photo.



Knights and courtiers

Broich Castle really looks like a castle, complete with sabre-rattling, lords of the castle, and princesses. More than a millenium of city and castle history await you in the **Historic Museum** in the upper castle. In accordance with the medieval ambience, jousting tournaments, castle rock concerts and the Broich Castle Christmas are held here. Mülheim once again shows itself to be a city for short journeys: Broich Castle is centrally located, and has a lot of green spaces to offer. And right next door to it is the park. Looking for the perfect party? Then how about the Tecklenburg Chambers venue. Or what about the regal ambience of the Knights' Hall, the Coat-of-Arms Room, or the Hearth Chamber? And, as everywhere else where Mülheim is at its most beautiful, the venue is also available for weddings.

Treasure hunting

When you've stocked up on enough nature and culture, there's nothing like heading off to do some **shopping**. You like it rural? Then you absolutely have to stop by in **Saarn village**. You prefer that city feeling? You can stroll from shop to shop just as easily in the Mülheim **city centre** as in the two malls, at **FORUM City**

and the Rhein-Ruhr Centre (RRC). We recommend going for a walk up and down "Schloßstraße", zig-zagging back and forth for cappuccino, as the cafés are all worthwhile. Then go to FORUM and pick out the best special offers from over 100 shops. Afterwards, march straight on through to the station, and head over to the RRC, where another 200 shops are waiting for you. And for drivers, there's no need to worry about parking spaces. There are loads of them, and they're free of charge. And if you enjoy your trivia, the RRC was the first shopping centre in Germany, and was built on the grounds of what was once the Humboldt colliery. Pure Ruhr Area!






It's not an area, it's an event.

For example, the "Zeche Zollverein" is now a living monument. The mine workings may have been decommissioned, but over 1,000 people now work here. And the visitors flood



Five Discovery Areas create orientation

The division of the Ruhr metropolitan region into its five Discovery Areas therefore creates a clearer sense of orientation for guests and visitors, allowing them to prepare better for their holiday travels or city break! Each area has its own special focus, and each has a portal city as a central contact point, helping you to find your way around and get to know the highlights of each area.

The RUHR Cultural Harbour is the Discovery Area around Duisburg, which also includes Mülheim an der Ruhr, right in the west of the metropolis. Living on and with the water plays a key role here. Alongside the world's largest inland harbour in Duisburg, the attractive range of leisure activities available in the Duisburg Inner Harbour district makes it one of the top addresses between the Rhine and Ruhr rivers. And Mülheim an der Ruhr naturally also scores considerable points with its 14 km of the Ruhr river, through the middle of the green city region.

In the north of the Discovery Area, in the district around Wesel, you can find the offshoots of the Ruhr Area and the transition to the green Lower Rhine region, between the Rhine and Lippe rivers.


The Discovery Area around **Oberhausen** presents itself as **RUHR spectacular & popular**. Let yourself be entertained, and dive into the joys of leisure.



August Macke – yearning for the lost paradise An exhibition from the foundation "Collection Ziegler" 2nd February to 27th April 2014

The art-collection of Mülheim's Nobel Prize-winner Karl Ziegler disposes of a significant part of artworks of August Macke. "One lived with him twice, his joyfulness emanated even on strange people", remembered the author Wilhelm Schmidtbonn about his friend and companion. Macke brought his life-affirming work-process on a simple formula: "For me working is a rejoicing of the nature", and the artwork "a song about the beauty of things." From his everyday life observations he screens and describes a peaceful being, that gives voice to this "yearning for the lost paradise" and evlves – in times of deep insecurities – a positive view on life.

With around 60 paintings, watercolours and drawings from private and museum property the context and topics of his works in its pre-studies and variations will be demonstrated. The visitor will get insights into the "workshop" of the artist and the

creative process of the "finding" of the pictures.














General travel conditions for our packages from Mülheimer Stadtmarketing und Tourismus GmbH (MST)

Dear Guest!

Please read the following travel conditions carefully. When you book a weekend package with us, you are accepting these terms and conditions.

1. Conclusion of the travel contract

- 1.1. When registering in writing, verbally, by telephone or by email, you shall be bindingly offering to conclude a travel contract with MST GmbH on the basis of our travel advertisement.
- 1.2. The contract shall be created exclusively through the receipt of a written booking confirmation. This shall not apply to booking confirmations issued fewer than 7 working days before the start of travel. In such cases, the booking confirmation constituting the binding conclusion of contract shall be issued by telephone or by email.
- 1.3. The person placing the booking shall be liable for all obligations of the other travel participants arising from the travel contract, where said person has expressly accepted these obligations by means of a separate written declaration.
- 1.4. If the content of the travel confirmation deviates from the content of the registration, this shall constitute a new offer from MST GmbH, which shall be binding for a period of 10 days. The contract shall be based on this new offer if the guest accepts this offer within this period.

2. Payment

- 2.1. Payments against the travel price before the termination of the trip shall only be requested or accepted upon presentation of a risk coverage certificate in the meaning of § 651k para. 3 of the German Civil Code.
- 2.2. A risk coverage certificate, in deviation from section 2.1., shall not be issued if
 - a) the trip does not last longer than 24 hours, does not include overnight accommodation, and the travel price does not exceed €75 per person.
 - the tourism location constitutes a legal person under public law, in relation to whose assets no insolvency proceedings are permissible.
 - the travel services do not include transportation to and

- from the trip location, and under the payment conditions agreed upon the full travel price only becomes due for payment upon completion of the trip.
- 2.3. At the time of issuing the booking-contract a deposit of 20% on the total amount is due to be paid. The final payment of the remaining amount has to be paid to MST GmbH 21 days prior to the date of travel. The right of the guest to retain a contested price increase demanded after the conclusion of the contract shall remain unaffected by this.

3. Services

- 3.1. Specifications in advertising material shall be binding for MST GmbH. If MST GmbH has expressly retained the right to alter the details or the prices in its advertising material, MST GmbH shall be entitled to stipulate a specific change to the advertised and price details before the conclusion of the contract, provided that they inform the travellers of this before registration for travel.
- 3.2. Section 3.1. notwithstanding, the contractual services shall be based on the performance description decisive at the time of conclusion of contract, and on the further agreements, in particular on the travel registration and travel confirmation.

4. Changes to services and prices

Alterations to and deviations from the agreed content of the travel contract that become necessary after the conclusion of contract, and which are performed in the utmost good faith by MST GmbH, shall be permitted provided that

these alterations or deviations are not significant, do not lead to a significant alteration in the travel service, and do not impair the overall layout of the trip booked. Potential warranty claims shall remain unaffected by this, where the altered services are defective. MST GmbH shall be obliged to inform the guest immediately regarding any alterations to or deviations from the agreed services. If necessary, MST GmbH shall offer the guest a change of booking or withdrawal from the contract free of charge.

5. Withdrawal by the guest, change of booking

- 5.1. The guest shall be entitled to withdraw from the trip at any time before the commencement of travel. The decisive factor shall be the receipt by MST GmbH of a declaration of withdrawal. The guest is advised to make such a declaration of withdrawal in writing.
- 5.2. MST GmbH shall claim the following cancellation rate as a percentage of the travel price in the event of withdrawal:

up to 30 days before	
commencement of travel	5%
from 29-21 days before	
commencement of travel	20%
from 20-14 days before	
commencement of travel	35%
from 13-7 days before	
commencement of travel	50%
from 7 days before	
commencement of travel	70%

5.4. The guest shall be entitled to provide evidence that the claim for compensation does not arise, or that the compensation should be significantly lower than the flatrates listed.

Important notes for our guests

- ***Prices and details subject to change without notice: "Subject to alterations to the advertisement (prices, accommodation, programmes, additional services, etc.) before the conclusion of contract, in particular we reserve the right to make price adjustments for the following reasons:

 1. as a result of increases in transportation costs after the publication of the advertising, 2. if the trip desired by the customer and described in the advertisement is only available in conjunction with additional purchases.
- Furthermore, your attention is drawn to sections 9 and 10 of the general terms and conditions (notice of defects in the case of travel defects, necessity of a reasonable notice period for termination, exclusion period for the assertion of claims after completion of travel and statutory period of limitation.)
- •••• We recommend the conclusion of insurance for withdrawal from travel and insurance to cover the costs of a return journey in the event of accident or illness from the insurance company "Die Europäische".

6. Unclaimed services

If as a result of an early return journey or other unavoidable reasons the guest does not take advantage of individual travel services, MST GmbH shall attempt to obtain a refund of the expenses saved from the service providers. This obligation shall not apply if the services are entirely insignificant or if statutory or official provisions prohibit such a refund.

7. Withdrawal and termination by MST GmbH

MST GmbH shall be entitled to terminate the travel contract without notice after the commencement of travel if the guest persistently disturbs the performance of the trip without heeding warnings from MST GmbH or its agents, or if the guest acts in breach of contract to such an extent that the immediate suspension of the contract is justified. If MST GmbH terminates the contract, it shall remain entitled to the travel price; it shall however be obliged to discount the value of the expenditures saved, and any profits gained by other utilisation of the services not claimed, including the sums paid by the service providers.

8. Limitation of liability of MST GmbH

The contractual liability of MST GmbH for damage that is not physical damage shall be limited to three times the travel price,

- a) where damage to a guest was caused neither deliberately nor through gross negligence, or
- b) where MST GmbH is only responsible for damage caused to a guest through the fault of a service provider.

Guarantee, termination by the guest, duty of disclosure

- 9.1. If the trip is not provided in accordance with the contract, the guest shall be entitled to demand redress. MST GmbH shall be entitled to refuse if this would require disproportionate expenditure. MST GmbH shall be entitled to provide redress in the form of a substitute service of equal value.
- 9.2. For the duration of non-contractual delivery of the trip, the guest shall be entitled to demand a corresponding reduction of the travel price. The travel price shall be reduced in accordance with the ratio in which the value of the non-defective trip at the time of sale stands to the actual value of the trip as delivered.
- 9.3. The guest shall be obliged to complain immediately to MST GmbH or to the contact point specified to the guest. If the guest culpably fails to report a defect, there shall be no right to a reduction in price.

- 9.4. If a trip is significantly impaired as a result of a defect, and if MST GmbH does not redress this within a reasonable period, the guest shall be entitled to terminate the travel contract; in the interests of the quest and for reasons of securing evidence, it is prudent for this termination to take place in writing. The same shall apply if it is not reasonable for the guest to accept the trip for good cause that is apparent to MST GmbH. The provision regarding a period for redress shall not be required if redress is impossible or if MST GmbH refuses, or if the immediate termination of the contract is justified by special interests of the guest. The guest shall be liable to MST GmbH for the portion of the travel price corresponding to the services utilised, provided that these services were of interest to the quest.
- 9.5. Irrespective of reduction or termination, the guest shall be entitled to demand compensation for non-ful-filment, unless the defect of the trip was not the responsibility of MST GmbH.

10. Exclusion of claims and statute of limitation

- 10.1. The guest shall be obliged to assert claims against MST GmbH for non-contractual provision of travel services within one month after the contractually planned completion of the trip, unless the failure to observe this period is not the fault of the guest.
- 10.2. Claims of the guest in accordance with section 10.1., with the exception of physical injury, shall be subject to a limitation period of one year after the contractually planned completion of the trip. The limitation period of one year shall not commence before the communication of the defect to the organiser by the guest. In the case of the organiser's gross neglicence, and in the case of malice, the claims described by section 10.1. shall be subject to a limitation period of three years.
